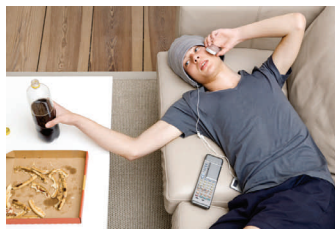

## Have you Heard?

A research study published in the August edition of the Journal of the American Medical Association cites adolescent hearing loss has increased over the last 15 years.

In adolescents 12 to 19 years old, one in five has evidence of some hearing loss while one in



20 has mild hearing loss.

Compared with survey data from 1988 to 1994, there has been a 30 percent increase of any hearing loss and a 70 percent increase in mild to more severe hearing loss.

Hearing loss is a common and under recognized public health problem that can influence a child's educational, psychological, and social development.

Hearing loss is more prevalent in adolescent males according to the researchers.
